"Can We Have a Shower?"

Recently, I was with a group of preachers sharing tales of church life, confessing mistakes we've made along the way in our work. One recalled when he was very new at a church, someone called and asked if they cold have a shower at the church. He replied that the church bathrooms were not equipped for showers. After a pause, she asked, "What are you talking about?" He responded, "What are YOU talking about?" She was wanting to hold a baby shower. He was still thinking down another path – babies don't take showers. You bathe them in the kitchen sink. Between one's mouth and another's ear, words sometimes change directions. Now, what am I talking about? Let me explain.

First, I'd like us to have a baby shower. On the Sunday before Christmas, Dec. 22, we will have a birthday party for Jesus in the CLC, with cake and punch, during the Sunday School hour. You can bring you "White Christmas" gifts then (or any time until then, food items can be placed under the tree in the sanctuary) and exchange Christmas cards as well. We will be putting out bags in the CLC to receive cards between members. The postage you save can be donated to a good cause, and you can enjoy seeing others opening your cards in person.

We hope this gathering time as a church family will be a great start to the Christmas season which we celebrate for 12 full days (French hen, gold rings and all) right up until Epiphany, which will be observed this year on Sunday, Jan. 5. Epiphany is the traditional day for recalling the visit of the Wise Men bearing gifts for the Christ child, in other words, a baby shower.

I propose we be wise too, and bring baby gifts to the manger, which will be passed along to Miriam's Promise, our Tennessee Conference

Secondly, could we have the other kind of shower too? We received a call not long ago from a homeless person seeking a place to shower and clean up. Like my clergy friend above, I had to say no, that we were not equipped for such. In times of disaster, the Red Cross and UMCOR will bring in shower trucks for folks who have lost homes to use temporarily. Homelessness is a quieter, less noticed disaster, experienced by the few, not the many, so is often not noticed. If we installed 1 or 2 showers in the church, we could meet the needs of both large and small scale disasters. If the Gospels are true, Jesus both fed his disciples and washed their feet as a show of his Grace to be carried out into the world as a witness to God's love and care for all. What would it take to make our building a welcoming refuge for this weary world's travelers who often find no access to an inn? "Tis the season to consider such concerns.
